Dwarf Honeysuckle	<i>Diervilla lonicera</i>	june yellow flowers 2.5'
Vernal Witch Hazel	<i>Hamamelis vernalis</i>	march orange/red flowers 12'
Common Witch Hazel	<i>Hamamelis vernalis</i>	october yellow flowers 10'
Smooth Hydrangea	<i>Hydrangea arborescens</i>	june/july white flowers 3'
Oak Leaf Hydrangea	<i>Hydrangea quercifolia</i>	june/july white flowers 5'
